

First Bangladeshi to study DDPH, RCS

for a Diploma in Public Dental Health (DDPH, RCS, England) at the Institute of Post Graduate Dentistry (Royal College), United Kingdom

He leaves Dacca for availing the World Health Organisation (WHO) scholarship on October 3.

Dr. K. A. Jalil and his guide-Professor Syed Monjurul Huq of the Dacca Dental College, have together just completed their two-year long study on "carries (dental decay) among students of universities, colleges and secondary schools." Prof. Syed Monjurul Huq is now busy compiling the findings of the study in the form of a report, which will be submitted to the Bangladesh Medical Council soon.

Dr. Jalil, son of late Khandoker Makhfuruddin Ahmed of Bhojeswar, Police Station Naria under the Shariatpur Sub-division of Fariapur, has been serving the Dacca Dental College as a teacher ever since he completed his studies at the same College.
