## Law Examination Centre

Sir,—It is useless to reiterate that considering the importance of Narayanganj, a Law College was established here in 1965 in spite of its being a Subdivisional town. From the very inception of the college students from far-flung areas such as Narsingdhi, Araihaaz, Munshiganj, Monohardi etc. have been reading in this college. Even today the following distribution of the students can be found in the college: Narsingdhi 20%, Monohardi 20%, Munshiganj 20%, Araihaaz 20%, Narayanganj and its suburbs 20%. An examination centre has also been in existence here since the birth of the college.

From reliable source it is learnt that the examination centre has been shifted from here and as a result any one willing to appear at the examination from this college must appear from Dacca from this time on. We fail to understand the reason behind it, but this decision of the authority has put the students of the ensuing LL. B. Examination appearing from Narayanganj into many difficulties. Let us point out some of the most important ones:

(1) The up and down journey between Dacca and Narayanganj is not an easy one but time consuming.

(2) There is risk too in the journey since road accident is a very common feature in our country.

(3) Students those who will reside at Dacca to avoid daily journey shall have to face accommodation problem which is very acute in the city.

(4) Monetary problems are also associated with the above problems. Generally the Law students come from poor, lower middle middle class families. This unnecessary expenditure will be an added burden to their guardians.
