## Nobel Chemistry prize for Britisher

STOCKHOLM. Oct. 17:—The 1978 Nobel Prize for Chemistry was today awarded to Dr. Peter Mitchell of Great Britain reports Reuter.

Dr. Peter Mitchell. 58, of Glynn Research Laboratories, Bodmin, Cornwall. Britain, was awarded the 165,000 dollar prize for his contribution to the understanding of biological energy transfer through the formulation of the Chemiosmotic Theory.

Dr. Mitchell, born in Mitcham, Surrey, obtained a doctorate in Biochemistry from Cambridge University in 1950.

From 1955 to 1963 he was Director of the Chemical Biology Unit, Department of Zoology, Edinburgh University before becoming Director of Research at the Glynn Research Laboratories, Cornwall in 1964.
