Show cause notice about college teachers' salary

The Subordinate Judge, Dacca, Mr Mohammad Hamidul Hoque, on Saturday asked the Government to show cause within one day why it should not be restrained by an order of temporary injunction from stopping the salary of the government college teachers, reports BSS.

The judge passed this order on an injunction petition filed by the General Secretary of the Bangladesh College Teachers Association. The petitioner also prayed for an ad-interim injunction against the Government restraining it from giving effect to the impugned order U/O 1961—Edn of November 20 1979.

Govt college teachers' strike continues

The Teachers of all units of Bangladesh Government College Teachers Association have been abstaining from duty since Monday. The teachers did not resume duty despite the Government order to stop payment of salary and threat of repressive measures, says a Press release.

Mrs Roushahara Rahman, Convener, Action Committee of Dacca College unit, said that the teachers of Dacca College were on full strike as per decision of the Association. They have also confirmed their oneness with the Association.

Meanwhile, Dacca College teachers have not responded to the strike call of the Government Colleges Teachers Association. Classes in the college are being held as usual. According to a Press release issued by Dr. Ali Ahmed Principal, Dacca College on Saturday.

The Principal has asked all students to attend their classes.

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
