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Superior Post Examination 1976

At long last the Bangladesh Public Service Commission published the final results of "Superior Posts Examination-1976" on July 13 of this year. Two years have passed in the process; but for no fault of the candidates themselves. We hope that appointment letters will soon be issued. As all the formalities, including a thorough medical examina-

tion; have already been completed; there is no ground for any further delay.

We now make an appeal to the government; particularly the Establishment Division to give at least two years' antedated seniority to all the successful candidates of this first ever regular and thoroughly competitive examina-

tion of the country since independence so that the loss of years can be made up. The top leaders and other representatives of the government have announced publicity several times that the government was keen to offer good positions to really talented

boys.

It is generally acknowledged by all concerned that those 138 candidates out of over nine thousand; who came out successful in a tough examination of 1600 marks are really talented; and genuinely competent. As such; it is increasingly felt that all these successful candidates should be offered really good positions so that the nation may get the service of its best talents. Therefore; we appeal again to the authority to reduce the number of declared vacancies of Section Officer to 15 and raise the number of posts in other services like civil

service; police service; foreign service; various categories of finance service etc. proportionately.

We should expect that all the existing rules of recruitment; including quota system; will strictly be honoured in the distribution of posts. A note; giving reference of existing rules and how they have been observed in individual cases should also accompany each appointment letter; so there can not be any room left for confusion among the candidates or their guardian.
