

Three teachers' bodies form federation

Three teachers' organisations Bangladesh College Teachers' Association, Bangladesh School Teachers' Association and Bangladesh Madrasa Teachers' Association have formed a federation under the name and style of 'Bangladesh Federation of Teachers' Association' (BFTA).

The Federation formed in a joint meeting of representatives from the three teachers' association held on Monday will work to spread quality and work-oriented education in the country. The BFTA will also fight, said a Press release of the Federation, for the implementation of UNESCO/ILLO recommendations of 1966 regarding the status of teachers and that of 1977 regarding the pay-scale of teachers.

A 16-member convening committee with five representatives including the President and Secretary-General of each association was also formed to organise the Federation. Professor A.F.M. Sharif ul Islam, President, Vice-President and Secretary-General respectively of the BFTA Mr. Abdul Mannan and Mr. Abdul Khaleque, President and Secretary-General respectively of Bangladesh School Teachers Association and Moulana Abdul Mannan and Moulana Khandoker Nasiruddin President and Secretary-General respectively of Bangladesh Madrasa Teachers' Association were present in the meeting.

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
