

Govt. working to evolve new edn. policy

Mr. Bari said, education has to be made really meaningful so that it serves the interests of our people instead of wasting time on things which do not have much relevance to our requirement. It cannot be expected that drastic changes will be brought about overnight.

Mr. Bari paid rich tributes to the memories of the martyrs of the Education Movement of 1962 and said that only the materialisation of their dreams can be the best homage to them.
