

Madrasha Board being constituted

Prime Minister Shah Azizur Rahman said in Dacca on Friday that madrasha board was being constituted for the development of madrasha education in the country, reports BSS.

Addressing a meeting of Madrasha superintendents and teachers at the Institute of Education and Research in Dacca Friday morning, the Prime Minister stressed that the madrasha education should be reorganised to serve the changing needs of the time.

Referring to the Islamic university proposed to be set in the country, Shah Azizur Rahman said that the university would include technical and agricultural courses.

He said that the Government had allocated Taka 1.17 crore in the Five-Year Plan for the development and functioning of 157 madrasha of the country. During the current year, he said the government had sanctioned Taka 60 lakh for 20 madrasha.

The meeting which was attended by State Minister for Education, Mr Abdul Baten was also addressed by Maulana Abdul Mannan, MP, President of the Madrasha Teachers Association.
