Admission in govt colleges

60,000 candidates against 7500 seats

CHITTAGONG, Nov 13:—At least 60,000 students having eligibility for college education have now been scrambling desperately for admission in the five government colleges in Chittagong city.

But there are hardly 7,500 seats now available for the entrants in these colleges.

The parents with their wards have been facing a baffling situation due to this admission hurdle. They are now found queuing for admission forms before all these colleges.

A total of 18,000 students including nine thousand in First Division came out successful in SSC Examination from the high schools in Chittagong city alone. Besides, as many as 24,000 candidates from rural areas are also seeking admission in the five government colleges in the port city.

But of the five colleges, Chittagong Government College has 1,800 seats for the freshers, Chittagong Commerce College 1,500 seats, Haji Mohammad Mohsin College 1600 seats, Chittagong Government City College 2,000 seats and Nasirabad Government Girls College 600.

There is also heavy pressure for admission into a handful number of reputed colleges. The colleges included Ispahani Public College, Cantonment Public College, Navy College and Chittagong University College.

Taking advantage of the unusual rush of admission seekers,
