### Cadet Colleges

Your 30th September editorial entitled "Cadet College" on the distinctions made between cadet colleges and the rest of institutions are altogether correct. It is pertinent to ask why students of other educational institutions cannot exhibit such good results though they follow the same syllabus. The reasons for this, are 1) there is no co-education in cadet colleges. Fire and fuel cannot exist side by side. 2) the students of cadet colleges live within the four walls of their institutions. 3) There are no infiltrations in their halls and no arms in their campus. 4) They lead a routine life from dawn to dusk and no association with worldly pleasures. 5) They are properly disciplined. Politics do not influence the teachers or students and private tuition is prohibited. 6) Admission is restricted to a certain number; in other educational institutions there is no such rigidity. All these points help to make cadet colleges what they are.
