Qualified teachers needed in non-govt high schools

CHUADANGA, May 5: The secondary education of Chuadanga district is being hampered for lack of teachers, specially of English, non-application of mordern method, and inadequate number of supervisions.

Qualified and talented persons do not take up teaching at the non-govt. Secondary High School as their profession because of the lack of bonus, gratuity and pension facilities

which are available in government high schools. A good number of schools in Chuadanga cannot pay even 20 per cent salary to teachers for fund constraint. Beside private schools having on other income cannot increase tuition fees because of government ban and as such teachers having no proper qualifications are engaged in those high schools.

Efficient English language teachers and good arithmatic teachers are not available in the non-govt high schools. Besides experienced science teachers are also very few in these schools.

The Headmasters and other high officials do not inspect classes and schools as a result teachers also do not perform their duties in the classes according to the principle of education. The teachers do not follow modern method of teaching. They impart lesson in the classes without any plan moreover.

The relation between managing committee and teaching staff does not remain good in the non-government high school. This also affects teaching process.
