Despite repeated requests from the Syndicate Dr. Rahman did not leave the Syndicate meeting. The meeting, however, formed an enquiry committee to probe into the incident and Ataur Rahman was granted forced leave up to April 16.

· It was resolved that the committee would submit its report by April 15. The committee, however, failed to submit its report in time and even now the report has not been submitted.

1. On April 30 the Syndicate decided that pending the submission of the enquiry report Dr. Rahman i be allowed to join his department and the faculty. The decision soon evoked a sharp reaction from different quarters including students and teachers.
