



Text-books not available in Tangail

MADHUPUR (Tangail), Jan. 24:—Text-books are not available at a mained closed from dawn to dusk the book stalls in Tangail district. Some books are, however, being sold at a very high price.

It is learnt that some books were published for distribution among the students. These are Islamic Studies for Class VI, Geometry and Islamic Studies for Class VII, Poetry, Islamic Studies for Class IX.

Tex-books of 1989 have been sold at a high rate. Social Studies of Class six are sold at Taka 15 instead of Taka 11, Bengali of Class VI at Taka 15 out instead of Tk. 10.30, English of Class VI, Bengali of Class VII, Mathematics of Class VIII and IX, Enligh of class IX are sold at a high rate.

A source told this correspondent that the new books will not be available in due time because some unscrupuluos traders hoarded the books of 1989. The new books will not be available at the market till the sale of old books. The traders will make windfall profit.

Last year almost all books were available in the market at a time. As a result the students could buy the books at a time. But this year the irregularities are found in the distrubution of text books.

The Govt. should take necessary measures so that all books can be available within January.

Chuadanga

A report from Chuadanga adds: Distribution of books in 257 Govt. and 49 non-Govt. primary schools has been started. A total of 95,500 sets of books has been received for the district for dustribution, a source told this correspondent.

It is learnt that 10,200, 13,900, 17,800, 19,800, 26,300, 7,500 books were received for Classes V, IV, III, II, I and pre-primary classes respectively for 306 primary schools of the district.

The source disclosed that 21,775 i 29,140, 26,400 15,350 sets of books have already been destributed in Chuadanga, Alamdanga, Damurhuda and Jibannagar upazilas of the district by the District Book-Distribution Committee headed by Deputy Commissioner, Chuadanga as Chairman.

It is reported that 91,500 books. have been distributed by this time in both Govt. and non Govt. Primary Schools of the district. The books have been distributed by the teachers of the schools.
