

Criteria for SSC compartmental exam under Comilla Board

COMILLA, Sept. 19:—The Comilla Secondary and Higher Secondary Education Board has in a notification outlined the criteria for the S.S.C. compartmental examination, reports BSS.

The board said the S.S.C. examinees of 1989 who have secured a total 500 marks or more but failed in one subject for not more than ten marks can appear in the compartmental examination. These unsuccessful examinees can sit for the compartmental examination through their respective schools along with the regular examinees who will sit for the S.S.C. examination to be held in 1990. If the subject of the compartmental examination is of two papers having practical subject then the examinees must have to sit for the practical examination along with the two papers.

The candidates unwilling to take part in the compartmental examination can sit for examination in all subjects as irregular candidates through their respective schools. But these examinees must have valid registration and sit for the examination according to 1990 syllabus, the notification said.

If any candidate securing less than 500 marks is shown in the compartmental list due to inadvertance it will be deemed as rejected. The compartmental examinees may seek admission temporarily in the higher secondary classes or equivalent classes at their own risk. Their admission will stand cancelled if they are unsuccessful in the compartmental examination.
