

41 can't appear in Bajitpur

Mass copying in Bogra SSC exam centres

BAJITPUR, Mar. 19:— The Headmaster of Bajitpur Town High School was manhandled and an assistant teacher of Dilalpur High School has been arrested on Thursday last on charge of giving false assurance of allowing 41 students to appear in the SSC examination.

It is alleged that an Assistant Teacher of Dilalpur High School Mr. Paresb Dhar in collusion with the Headmaster of the same school collected Taka 82,000 from 41 students and assured them to appear in the S.S.C. examination but they could not supply admit card to them. The students having no admit cards till first day of the S.S.C. examination became angry and manhandled Mr. Abdul Awal, the Headmaster of the Bajitpur Town High School in the SSC examination centre of his alleged involvement in the matter.

A case has been registered with Bajitpur Police Station while the Headmaster of Dilalpur High School has been absconding.

151 expelled in Bogra

A report from Bogra states that 151 SSC examinees were expelled on the first day of SSC examination from 15 examination centres in Bogra. Out of 12,681 examinees 11,246 appeared in the examination.

Mass copying was reported from almost all the centres of the district. Hundreds of outsiders and helpers were seen in the examination centres. In some centres it was very difficult on

the part of examinees to write answer scripts due to disturbance of outsiders in the examination halls.

Teachers and invigilators were seen helping examinees by supplying copies and dictating answers. In some centres magistrates were harassed for expelling examinees for adopting unfair means in the examination halls. The SSC examination of March 17 may be compared with the SSC examination of 1972.
