4,49,342 appear in SSC exam today

Education Minister Sheikh Shahidul Islam has sought cooperation of all to check adoption of unfair means in the Secondary School Certil cate (SSC) examination which begin throughout the country today.

Addressing a news conference ce at his ministry's conference room, the Minister disclosed that a total of 4.49,342 candidates including 1,37,211 girls are appearing in the SSC examinations under four education
