centre in Dahagram, Angorpota enclaves

RANGPUR,June 8:—The people of Dahagram and Angorpota encalves did not see the ray of hope for the development of the enclaves although eleven months elapsed after the handing over of the Tin Bigha. Corridor on June 20 last year.

The road communication, health service, education and agriculture which are the mainstay to improve

the lots of the enclave people remain neglected.

Most of the roads inside the en claves have been damaged by rain and flood waters and developed cracks and holes making them unfit

for vehicular traffic.

There is no health centre in the enclaves and hundreds of ailing people of the enclaves have been suffering for want of medical facilities. Patgram thana headquarters, six miles away from enclaves has no transport facilities with the enclaves.

The enclaves people are deprived of higher educational facilities as there is no high school. At present there are a non-government junior high school, a forkania madrasha in the enclaves. Four primary schools, two of them government, are func-. tioning in the enclaves.

In agriculture sector, the enclaves people are deprived of irrigation facilities and supply of necessary inputs to boost production although thé enclaves possesses fertile land. The crops produced abundantly in the enclaves are sold at a low price in the absence of marketing facilities.

A buge quantity of stones and boulders found under 2 to 3 feet/ depth in the enclaves are being taken away by people.
