## 50.83 p.c. pass Comilla Board HSC exams

COMILLA, Oct 21:—The results of the Higher Secondary Certificate (HSC) examinations of 1995 under Comilla Education Board were published today that showed 50.83 per cent success.

A total of 1,12,636 examinees appeared in the examination of which 57,249 came out successful. Of the successful examineer 7,892 got First Division, 37,534 got Second Division and 11,823 got Third Division.

Students from Science and Agriculture groups recorded highest percentage of pass with 66.98, following 44.80 from Humanities Group and 56.70 per cent from the Commerce Group.

The percentage of pass of male students was higher than that of the female students. According to Board office, 73,269 male examinees appeared out of which 38,509 passed showing a success of 52.56 per cent while out of 39,367 female examinees

18,740 came out successful showing the percentage of pass at 47.60.

The group-wise percentage of pass is as follows: in Science Group and Agriculture Group 19,599 examinees \* appeared in the examination out of which 5767 got First Division, 6960 got Second Division and 401 got

Third Division. In Humanities Group 72,549 examinees appeared in the examination out of which 1,254 got First Division, 22,167 got Second Division and 9,084 got Third Division.

In Commerce Group 20,488 examinees appeared of which 871 got First Division, 8,407 got Second Division and 2,338 got Third Division.

In the Combined Merit List (Science & Agri Science Group), the First position was bagged by Asif Mahbub of Fauzderhat Cadet Col-See Page 12 Col. 4

lege obtaining 932 marks and distinctions in Mathematics, Physics, Chemistry and Statistics.

The second position went to Mohammad Mohiuddin of Comilla Cadet College obtaining 924 marks and distinctions in Mathematics, Physics, Chemistry and ED.

The third position was bagged by Md Rashedujjaman of Fauzderhat Cadet College who obtained 906 marks with distinctions in Mathematics, Physics, Chemistry and Statistics.
