Alim, Fazil, Kamil exams results out

The results of Alim, Fazil and Kamil examinations of 1994 held in the months of September and October last year under Bangladesh Madrasah Board were published in Dhaka on Saturday, reports BSS.

According to a Board notification the percentage of bass is 63.87 in Alim examinations, 67.54 in Fazil and 85.25 in Kamil examinations.

A total of 29,532 students including 2,462 female candidates appeared in three groups (General, Science and Muzahbid-e-Mahir) in Alim examinations of them 1101 got first division, 8180 second division and 9582 third division.

Fazil examinations 237 secured first division, 5264 second division and 5102 got third division.

In four groups (Haditch, Fikah, Talseer and Adah) of Kamil examinations a total of 8583 students' including 83 female candidates sat in the examinations of which 582 got first division, 5583 second division and 1152 secured third division.

Nur Mohammad Masum of Madrasah-e-Alia, Dhaka bearing roll number one topped the combined merit list of Alim examinations securing 896 marks. The second and third positions went to Mohammad Safiullah of Farazikandi Oysia Alia Madrasah of Chandpur bearing roll 731 (Science) and Mohammad Ariful Kabir Chowdhury of Tamirul Millat Kamil Madrasah, Dhaka bearing roll 4037 (general). Safiullah and Kabir secured 867 and 854 marks respectively.

In Fazil examinations Mohammad Moniruzzaman of Borhanuddin Alia Madrasah Bhola, bearing roll no. 11167 stood first securing 747 marks. Mohammad Mostafa Hossain of Karuna Mokamia Alia Madrasah, Barguna bearing roll 11569 became second securing 744 marks. The third position went to Mohammad Muniruzzaman of the same Madrasah bearing roll 11568 who got 741 marks.

The combined merit list of Kamil examinations was topped by Mohammad Abu Jafar Knan of Madrasah-e-Alia, Dhaka bearing roll 8141 (Adab) securing 907 marks in his credit. The second position was shared by Mohammad Abdus Salam · of Tamirul Millat Makil Madrasah, Dhaka bearing roll 196 (Hadith) and Md. Mahbubur Rahman of Dhamti - Islamic Alia Madrasah, Comilla bearing roll 4245 (Hadith) both of whom secured 843 marks. Mohammad Zahirul Islam of Tamirul Millat-Kamil Madrasah, Dhaka, bearing roll 195 (Hadith) became third getting 838 marks.
