

HSC exams to be held in fair manner

Remain alert against those spreading confusion

The government has urged all concerned to remain alert about the activities of the intriguers, who are out to create panic among the coming Higher Secondary Certificate (HSC) examinees and the guardians, an official handout said in Dhaka on Saturday, reports BSS.

It said, the government is observing with grave concern that a particular quarter is indulged in intrigues centring on the ensuing HSC examination.

The quarter, it said, is attempting to create panic among the examinees and the guardians as a part of its conspiracies by printing false question papers throughout the country.

The Ministry of Education said with assertion that no question papers of the HSC ex-

amination was leaked out.

The handout said the government had got some indications that an unscrupulous quarter may spread confusion by printing more questions papers.

It is the responsibility of all patriotic citizens of the country to resist those anti-social elements, the handout added.

Education Minister ASHK Sadek on Saturday expressed grave concern at the activities of a particular quarter centring on the HSC examination.

He sought cooperation of conscious all concerned to build resistance against such destructive activities.

The Education Minister advised the HSC examinees not to be misled by at any sort of con-

fusion and publicity.

He expressed the hope that the HSC examination would be held fairly despite many provocations and intrigues.

Meanwhile, the Ministry of Education has completed all preparations to hold the HSC examination fairly.

The Ministry urged the people to hand over those, who would be found selling or distributing false question papers, to the law-enforcing agencies.

Steps, the handout said, have been taken to take stern legal actions against those anti-social elements.

The Education Ministry urged the newspapers and other media to inform the Ministry or the Education Board first if they get (media) any information about the leakage of question papers.
