



Action against 1,201 Jessore HSC examinees

JESSORE: Seventy nine thousand, seven hundred and seventy five candidates 55,497 males and 24,278 females are appearing in Secondary School Certificate (SSC) examination, 1987 under Board of Intermediate and Secondary Education, Jessore in 150 centres under Khulna division.

These centres are nine in Patuakhali, five in Barguna, 21 in Barisal, 12 in Pirojpur, six in Bhola, eight in Jhalakati, 15 in Khulna, 14 in Bagerhat, nine in Satkhira, 17 in Jessore, four in Narail, nine in Jhenidah, five in Magura, nine in Kushalia, two in Meherpur and five in Chuadanga.

In Science Group 31,494 examinees are appearing in the examination. Of them 24,314 are male and 7180 female.

In Humanities groups, 42,210 examinees are appearing. Of them 30,429 are male and 16,781 are female. There are 1071 private candidates. Of them 754 are male and 317 females.

The highest number of Examinees are from Barisal district 10,408 and the smallest number of examinees are from Meherpur district 1,333.

Disciplinary action has been taken against 1201 examinees who appeared in HSC examination under Board of Intermediate and Secondary Education, Jessore in 1986 for adopting unfair means and other offences in the examination. This action has been taken in a recent meeting of the Disciplinary Committee of the Board.

The results of 703 examinees were cancelled for one year while the results of another 385 examinees were cancelled for 1986 and that they will not be allowed to appear in 1987 examination.

Besides, 108 examinees were debarred from appearing in examination for 1987 and 1988 while another five examinees were debarred from appearing in the HSC examinations for 1987, 1988 and 1989. These five examinees were Mongla-7,

Patuakhali-87, Meherpur-718, Jhenidah-132 and Rajapur-305.

Besides, another 33 candidates were suspended for next meeting.

The Board Disciplinary Committee have also taken punitive action against a number of invigilators and examiners for violating Board's rules and regulation and for adopting unfair means and corrupt practices.
