

Degree exam answer scripts on sale

NARSINGDI, Nov. 4:—One hundred and eighteen answer scripts of the on-going degree (pass) examinations of Dhaka University were recovered from Bramondi Samabaya Market this morning while those were being sold.

It is reported that Ali Azam, a retired police Sub-Inspector found those scripts at a grocery shop. The Sub-Inspector asked Yunus Miah an employee of the Narsingdi Government College to see the answer scripts. It was found that the name of the Bhairab Centre was mentioned on



the top sheet of the scripts and code number 77 was marked.

Among the total 118 scripts, 41 were of the third paper of Zoology bearing Roll Number from 44248 to 44292.

In the second bundle there were 26 answer scripts. Those were the third part of the Management subject of the Commerce Faculty, containing Roll. Number 53540 to 53567. The rest 51 scripts were the third part of the Islamic History and Culture bearing Roll Number 16003 to 16066.

Tuesday at the Bhairab centre under Dhaka University. The scripts were sent to Narsingdi Government College with the alleged seller sweeper Nirmal Das. Nirmal Das told this correspondent that he managed these scripts from a minor boy, by Taka eight only and brought those to the market for selling. He lived in Narsingdi railway colony but nobody knows him, it is alleged.

The Vice-Principal of the Narsingdi Government College informed the Dhaka University authority and local administration about this matter. The guard of the Chittagong first passenger train informed the station master of Jinardi railway station that a percel packet was missing from his train.

It is alleged that the Narsingdi Station Master did not cooperate with the Narsingdi College administration in this regard.

A case has been registered with the Narsingdi police station in this connection. The recovered answer scripts have been kept in custody at the Narsingdi Police Station as per the instruction of the Dhaka University.
