44.10 pc pass HSC exams

 The results of the Higher Secondary Certificate (HSC) examinations held under all the four education boards of the country were announced yesterday. An average of 44.10 per cent of the candidates came out successful. The performance of Dhaka and Comilla boards was much above the national average while that of Jessore and Rajshahi boards was much below the average. A total of 2,97,120 candidates appeared in the examinations in four boards of whom 131,031 came out successful, constituting 44.10 per cent of the total. The percentage of successful candidates was 57.75 in Dhaka Board, 45.69 in Jessore Board, 31.70 in Comilla Board and 28.79 in Rajshahi and Jessore boards respectively. Of the total candidates, 217,320 were male and the rest 79,800 female. In Dhaka Board, 51,939 candidates came out successful out of a total of 89,940. In Comilla Board the number of successful candidates was 33,866 while 65,504 appeared in the examinations. In Rajshahi Board, 26,322 candidates, out of a total of 76,017 passed in the examinations and in Jessore Board 18,904 candidates came out successful while the total number of candidates was 65,659. Of the successful candidates in Dhaka Board 6,957 secured first division, 32,939 secured second division, and 12,043 candidates were placed in the third division. This was followed by the Comilla Board with 2064 candidates securing first division, 18,825 placed in second division and the rest 12,977 in third division. In Rajshahi Board, 1,944 candidates were placed in the first division; 13,901 in second division and 10,477 in third division. Of the successful candidates in Jessore Board 1,523 secured first division, 10,673 got the second division and the rest 6,708 passed in third division. Of the female candidates in Dhaka Board, 59.21 per cent was successful as against 57.19 per cent of the male candidates. In Comilla Board, percentage of success of female and male candidates was 52.47 and 51.46 respectively. In Jessore Board, 52.60 percent of the female candidates came out successful as against 51.19 per cent of the male candidates. In Rajshahi Board, percentage of success of female and male candidates was 52.47 and 51.46 respectively. 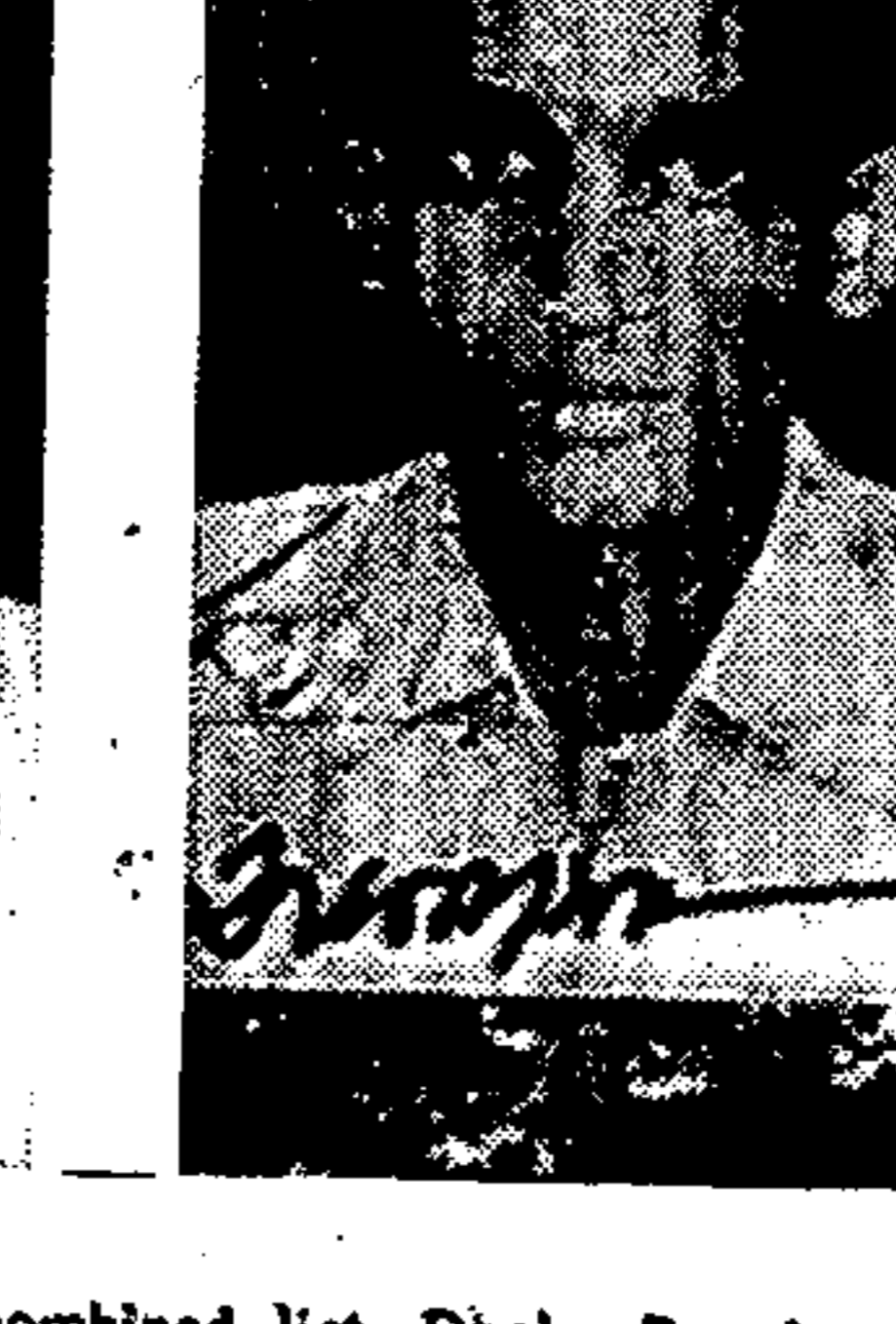
