44.01 p.c. pass in four boards

# HSC results announced

The results of Higher Secondary Certificate (HSC) examinations of 1988 under four education boards have been announced on Thursday showing 44.01 per cent of the examinees as successful.

217,320 male and 79,800 female candidates passed the examinations out of total 297,120 candidates. The percentage of successful male candidates was 44.41 while the percentage of successful female candidates was 43.26.

The percentage of the successful candidates in Dhaka Board was 57.75, highest among the four boards. The percentage of the three boards were Comilla 51.70, Rajshahi

34.62 and Jessore 28.79.

A total of 89,940 candidates appeared from Dhaka Board. Of them 51,939 came out successful. In Comilla Board 65,505 examinees appeared and 33,866 of them have been passed. In Rajshahi Board 76,017 appeared in at the examinations. Of them 26,322 came out successful. In Jessore Board out of a total of 65,659 candidates 18,904 have been passed.

In Dhaka Board 6,957 got First Division, 32,939 got Second Division and 12,043 over came the examinations in Third Division.

In Comilla Board 2,064 secured first Division, 18,825 examinees got

Second Division while 12,977 passed in Third Division.

In Rajshahi Board 1,944 got First Division, 13,901 Second Division and 10,477 got third Division.

In Jessore Board 1,523 got first Division, 13,901 secured Second Division and 10,477 passed in Third Division.

The examinations were held from June 9 to July 6. Due to devastating floods the announcement of the result has been delayed one month.

The HSC examinations were held in 601 centres including two foreign centres.
