Mass copying in HSC exam. halls

BOGRA, July 5.—Mass copying has been reported from almost all the HSC examination centres of the district.

The main characteristics of this year's HSC examination is that enormous facilities for adopting unfair means in the halls have been extended to the examinees by the invigilators, it is alleged.

In some colleges, teachers have been instructed by the college management committees influential persons not to expel rather help the examinees in adopting unfair means in the examination halls for the so-called interest of the college, it is further alleged.

A meeting of course was held to check unfair means in examination halls at the district council auditorium with Mr. Aminul Islam, Deputy Commissioner, Bogra in the chair before commencement of the HSC examinations. The Deputy Commissioner requested all principals of colleges, upazila chairman, UNOs, magistrates, police personnel and other district level officers present the meeting, to check unfair means by examinees in the halls.

It is observed that students generally rush to those colleges where they get copying facilities with the examination hall. It is also observed that the number of students has decreased alarmingly before filling up the examination forms in those colleges where adequate measures to check unfair means by the students in the examination halls are taken. Most of the private colleges are allowing copying facilities to the examinees to

attract students for their existence as the private colleges, it is alleged. The peculiar policy is being adopted even by some of the government colleges, it is also alleged.

This year 1127 students filled up examination forms from Gabtali College, 1000 students from Shibganj College, 868 students from Shariakandi College, 807 students from Dupchanchia College, 750 from Nandigram College and 760 students from Kahaloo College for appearing at the HSC examinations although the number of admitted students regular in the first year classes or before filling up examination forms in those colleges little over half.

On the other hand, 300 students filled up forms from Govt. A. H. College, 250 students from Govt. Shah Sultan College, 230 students from Govt. Nazir Akhtar College and 200 students from Govt. Mujibur Rahman Women's College for appearing at the HSC examinations although the number of students in the first year classes was double in those colleges.

It is further alleged that a large number of students left the Govt. colleges and got themselves admitted into the private colleges without transfer certificates.

It may be mentioned here that only 400 students were expelled for adopting unfair means in the examination halls throughout the district upto June 29.

The Board authority should take appropriate measures to check the prevailing anarchy and corruption in the educational arena, it is felt.
