Her father Lsfond Gomes is an advocate of Bangladesh Supreme Court. She hopes to be a Chartered Accountant in future.



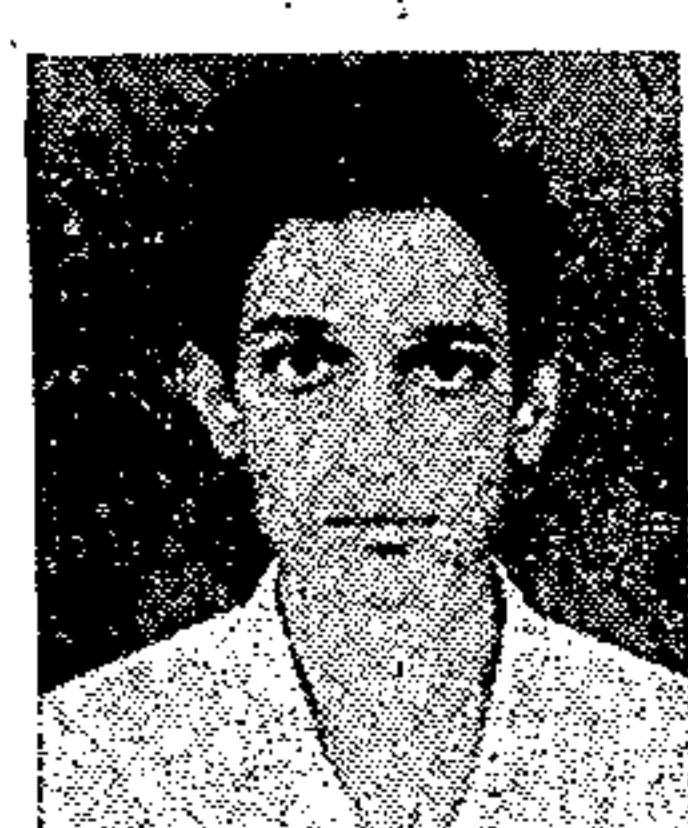
Stands Third

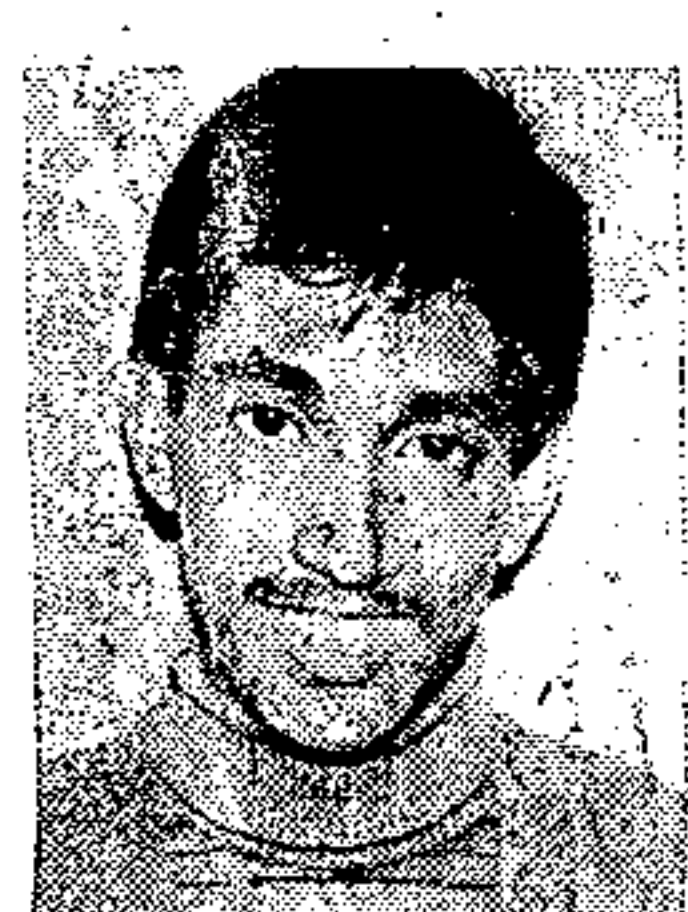
