HSC exams begin

2,000 expelled in Dhaka Board

The Higher Secondary Certificate (HSC) examinations under four Boards of Intermediate and Secondary Education began on Thursday under tight security-against adoption of any unfair means.

About 2000 examinees were expelled from different centres of Dhaka Board for adopting unfair means. Official sources said that more reports of expulsion were coming from different districts and Upazilas, till the writing of this report at 10-30 p.m.

577 in Rajshahi

BSS report adds:—A total of 577 students were expelled on the first day of the HSC examinations from 32 centres out of 140 under Rajshahi Education Board on Thursday.

Official sources said that 389 students were expelled in Bogra, 155 in Rajshahi and 33 Natore.

Another report from Khulna says:—At least 73 candidates were expelled from different examination centres of the city on the first day of the HSC examinations.

The Additional Deputy Commissioner General, Khulna, said that 5 candidates were expelled from City College, 16 from Sundarban College, Daulatpur, and Suhrawardy College in the city. He also said that the law and order situation around the examination centres in city was peaceful.

Our Narshingdhi correspondent reports: 120 candidates were expelled from six Upazila centres of the district for copying in the examination.

Our Kishoreganj correspondent says: 99 examinces have been expelled from seven Upazila centres. Of them 51 were expelled from Kishoreganj Sadar upazila and 27 from Pakundia centre.

Our Munshiganj correspondent adds: About 79 examinees have been expelled from five centres of the district on Thursday. About 3,293 candidates are appearing at the current HSC examinations in Munshiganj district.
