## 5,000 HSC examinees under Jessore Board expelled

JESSORE, July 19 (BSS):
About 5,000 H.S.C. examinees
under different centres of
Jessore Board of Intermediate
and Secondary Education
(BISE) have been expelled
during the examinations this
year for adopting unfairmeans
and other offences.

Chairman, Jessore BISE said that he had information of received unfairmeans being adopted by 3364 examinees. The number sent to him by secretaries of respective examination centres included 943 from greater Jessore district, 824 from greater Khulna district, 1988 from greater Barisal district, 373 from greater Patuakhali district and 256 from 'greater Kushtia district. Informed sources said that this figure would cross 5000 when full reports reached.

Besides, 29 invigilators were barred to enter examination halls for their alleged involvement in unfair practices and negligence to duties. These invegilators were either expelled by the Chairman of Jessore Education Board Prof Gazi Abdus Salam or by the district administrations.

Jessore Education Board earlier formed 13 vigilence teams with senior college teachers and journalists for supervision and smooth holding of examinations. Most of these expulsions were made by these vigilence teams.

3037 S.S. C examinees and
4411 HSC examinees were expelled during 1981; and 1597
SSC examinees and 2408 HSC examinees were also expelled in 1987 examinations. 78 invigilators were also expelled during S S C and H S C examination in 1988. The disciplinary committee of the Board in subsequent meetings adopted verious punitive measures against these examinees and invigilators.
