Mofussil colleges encourage copying in exam halls?

KURIGRAM, Dec. 28:—Degree examinees are rushing to the colleges of the rural areas in order to take the advantage of adopting unfairmeans in the examination halls.

Meanwhile, a large number of students have been admitted to the colleges of the rural areas to appear at the Degree Examinations of 1989 (to be held in 1990) under Rajshahi University after taking transfer certificates from most of the colleges of the district headquarters.

A section of teachers of mofussil colleges hve now got an opportunity to earn money from the students rushing to their colleges.

The number of degree examinees of the colleges at the district headquarters has dramaticall deereared.

Accomimadation problem

Due to the influx of students in to examination centres of the mofussil colleges an acute problem of accomodation has been created. It is now impossible to solve the problem.

According to teachers of some colleges at the district headquarters the examinees rush to the rural centres with the hope to adopt unfairmeans in the examinations halls. The influx of students from the colleges of district headquarters to the rural colleges has abnormally increased during the past three years. Because the percentage of pass at the rural colleges is much higher than those of the urban colleges. It has become possible for the facility of adopting unfairmeans in the examination halls.

Unfairmeans encouraged

According to a source, the rush of the examinees was observed in the Bhurungamari College, Nageswari

College, Ulipur College, Hatibandha College, Domar College in greater Rangpur during the last degree examinations.

It is alleged that the adoption of unfairmeans in the examinations halls is encouraged in many rural centres instead of preventing the examinees from doing it. The examinations in district headquarters is conducting in a strict situation for the last three years. More than 100 examinees were expelled in Degree Examination from Kurigram Govt College centre alone in the last degree examination.

It is further gathered that a section of teachers are also involved in this unfairmeans at rural centres. The matter has been brought to the notice of the authority many times but no effective action has been taken against the concerned teachers and the concerned examination centres.

The Rajshahi University authority withheld the results of 8 degree examination centres in 1988.
