

592 SSC examinees, 8 teachers expelled

A total of 592 candidates in the Secondary School Certificate Examinations, 1984, were expelled from different centres under four education boards till Tuesday, the third day of the examination. Eight teachers were also expelled from Alamdanga centre under Jessore Board on March 8 and 11 for their alleged involvement in helping candidates in adopting unfair means.

It may be mentioned here that SSC Examinations under Dhaka, Comilla, Rajshahi, and Jessore Boards began on March 8. Examinations in three major subjects like Bengali, English and Mathematics were completed till Tuesday.

During the last three days of

examinations 299 candidates were expelled from various centres under Jessore Board. One hundred and seventyfive students were expelled from Comilla Board while a total of 118 candidates were expelled from Rajshahi Board. The figure of Dhaka Board was not available. However, officials of the Dhaka Board told this correspondent that there were

some cases of expulsion, but figure was not ready at the moment.

About four lakh 12 thousand students are appearing at the SSC Examinations this year. Under Dhaka about 1,22,000 candidates under Rajshahi Board 94,445 students. Under Comilla Board 96,200 students and about one lakh candidates under Jessore Board are appearing at the Examinations. No untoward incident is reported from any centre in the capital city. A high official of the board claimed that examinations were held peacefully.
