

JN College exam centre suspended for three years

Dhaka University Syndicate at a meeting on Sunday decided to suspend the examination centre at Jagannath University College for the next three years.

The Syndicate meeting also decided that the teachers and officials related to the 1983 Degree (Pass) Examination at Jagannath College would be kept away from all the responsibilities of university level examinations for the next three years.

Earlier the university instituted an Inquiry Committee to look into the matter of unfair means, corruption and violation of examination rules by the students and the centre authority.

The Inquiry Committee in its report also suggested definite action against the Principal, Vice-Principal and other teachers and officials for their complete failure in conducting the examination.

During the process of investigation the result of 531 candidates were kept withheld for about 8 months and it was

released on Monday. According to the university authority, a total of 21 candidates were expelled for four years for adopting unfair means in the examination.
