

Uncertainty over SSC exams

Uncertainty looms large over the holding of the S.S.C. Examinations of the four Boards scheduled to be held on April 11.

Bangladesh Shikshak Samity (Bangladesh Teachers' Association) whose members are on strike since February 4 demanding 'nationalisation' of their services has enjoined upon all its members not to accept any responsibility for conducting the S.S.C. Examinations.

No board official was available for his comment.

The Teachers' Association has also appealed to its members not to accept any responsibility for conducting the Parliamentary elections.

The strike by the teachers of the private schools entered the 20th day on Saturday.

The teachers and other employees of the private schools throughout the country have struck work demanding 'nationalisation' of their services since February 4.

Bangladesh Shikshak Samity (Bangladesh Teachers' Association) in a statement on Saturday appealed to all teachers and other employees of all private schools to continue their strike till the fulfilment of their demands.

The association will hold a public rally at Baitul Mukarram Square on February 28 to explain their views and to enlist people's support.

The association has also drawn up a nine-point programme with the aim of intensifying their movement.

The association has decided to hand over a memorandum to the President on February 23, the day of their public rally.
