# Results of four boards announced

## 66.39 pc pass SSC exams

The results of the Secondary School Certificate (SSC) examinations held in March-April this year under the four education boards of the country were simultaneously announced yesterday.

Under the four boards—Dhaka, Rajshahi, Comilla and Jessore—a total of 3,66,381 students appeared at the examinations and 2,41,134 came out successful, the overall percentage of pass being 66.39. Among the successful students 35,544 were placed in first division, 1,69,069 in second division and 36,521 in third division.

Of the total candidates, 2,59,593 were boys of whom 1,72,479 came out successful and 1,06,788 were girls of whom 68,655 succeeded in the examinations. The percentage of pass

among the boys and girls are 66.44 and 64.39 respectively.

In Dhaka Board, a total of 1,11,660 students appeared at the examination of whom 64,946 came out successful, the percentage of pass being 58.16. Of the successful students, 10,305 were placed in first division, 46,11 in second division and 7,730 in third division.

Under Rajshahi Board, in all 89,679 students set for the examination of whom 61,698 succeeded. The percentage of pass 68.79. Among the successful students, 7,324 got first division, 42,576 second division and 11,798 third division.

In Comilla Board, a total of 84,304 students appeared at the examination and 60,668 Contd. on page 8 col. 5

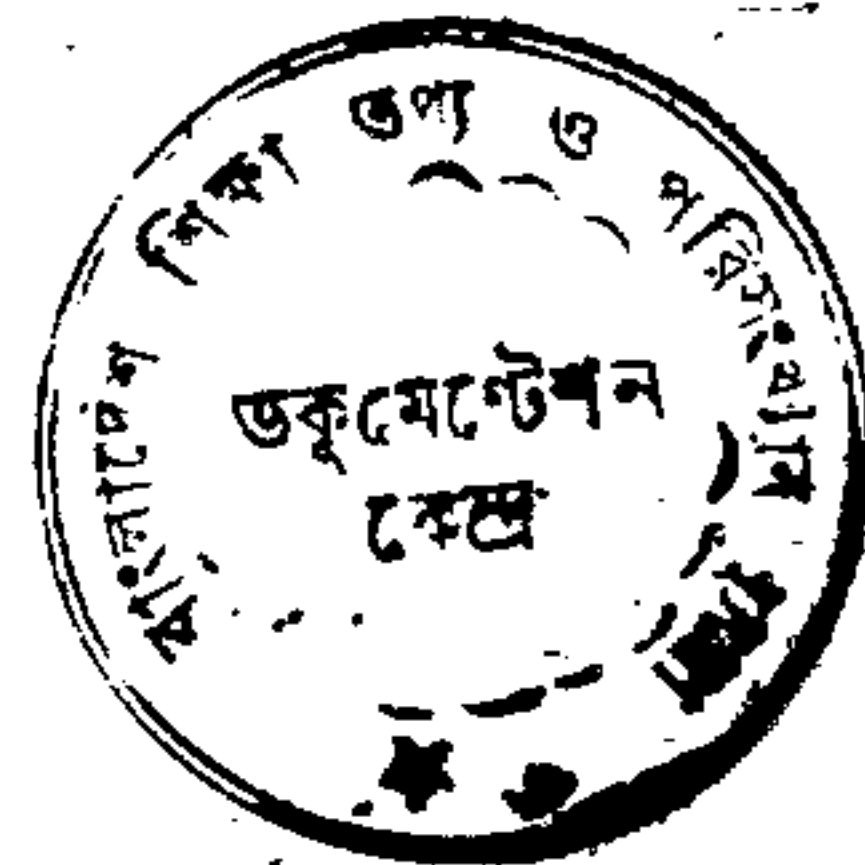

ers got information from "reliable sources" that Tapash was going to top the list. The agitated students said the results indicated a conspiracy on discrimination in favour of Cadet Colleges. On Wednesday, a local daily carried a story on the SSC results in which it was stated quoting reliable sources that Zahid Hasan topped the meritlist. Talking to the New Nation Zahid Hasan's father Mr Rahmat Ali, an Awami League leader, said he had information from very dependable sources that his son was deliberately deprived of his due. He, however did, not quote those sources.

In a written statement he demanded re-examination of the answer scripts of the two candidates who secured first and second places. he also demanded that the original tabulation sheets' be shown to him.

Talking to the New Nation, he alleged that five of the head examiners were appointed from the two cadet colleges under the Board.

He said many people did not like the concept of cadet colleges. If the system was to continue students of those colleges should be asked to appear at the examination from centres other than their own colleges, he felt.

When contacted, a high official of the Dhaka Board said they had nothing to do if somebody believed in any information leaked out by some one without having any valid authentication. He said the results were published yesterday and if anybody claimed to have known anything beforehand, he had done it at his own risk and responsibility.

Sheikh Hasina It may be mentioned that Awami League chief Sheikh Hasina, who was passing through Assad Gate area while the students were demonstrating there, was stopped by the students who complained to her of the "malpractice."

The opposition leader was then taken to Dhanmandi School where she talked to both the teachers and the students. She expressed her results over what she was told and said there should be a profe into the matter.

Zahidul Mursaleen Joy was smiling when we approached him at his Jhikatala residence. His mother was also happy. When asked he said he was



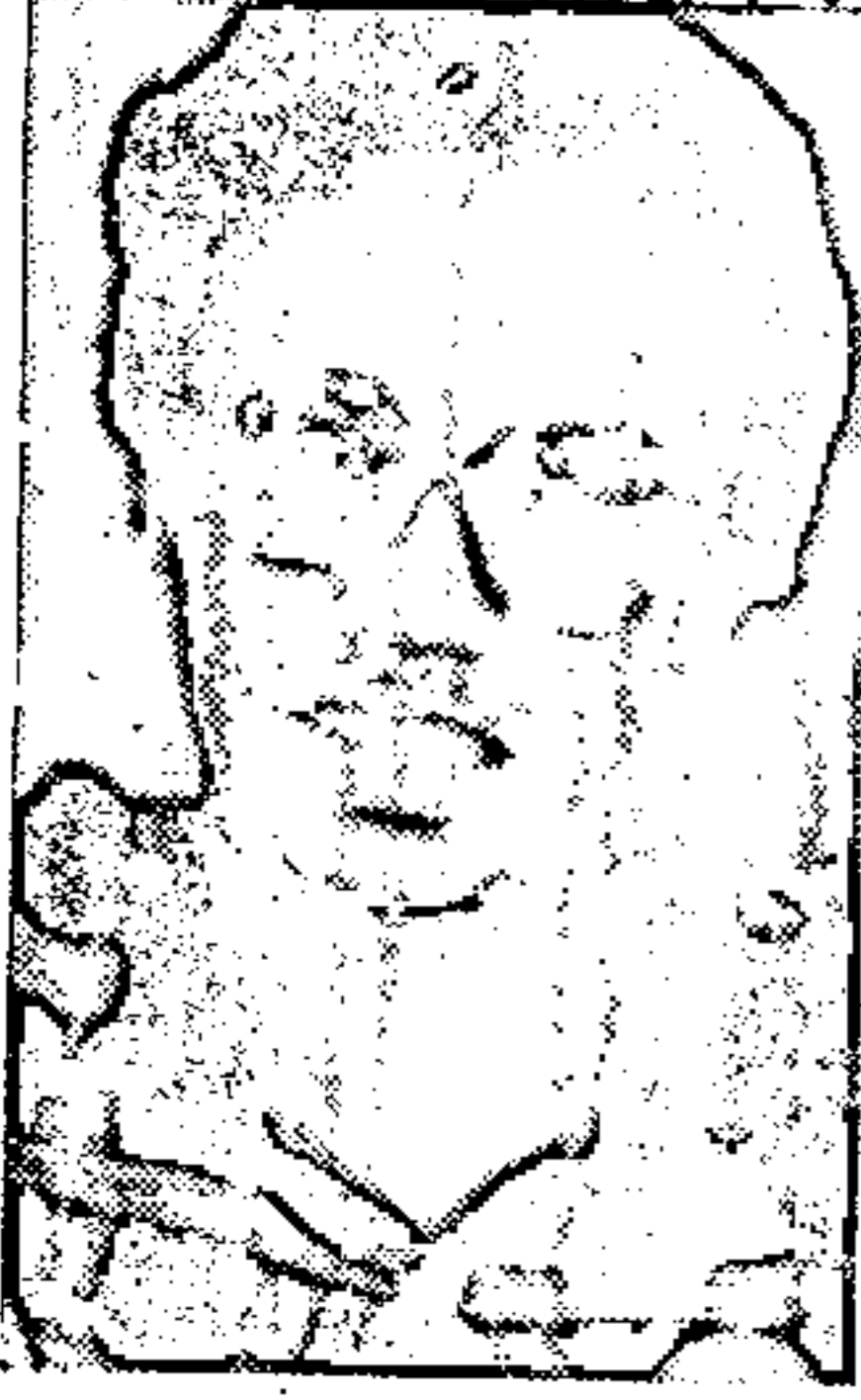

Talking to us he said he wants to undertake higher studies in nuclear physics and wants to take up teaching as profession with a keen interest in research. Justifying his desire he said by the year 2050 all the conventional energy resources will end up. The only alternative source would be nuclear energy and for Bangladesh that technology would be more vital.

Talking to us he said before the examinations he used to study 12 to 14 hours a day. One third of which were spent for studying reference books, magazines, newspapers and encyclopedia.

At this age Tapas has developed a habit of expressing himself besides acquiring knowledge.

His first book entitled 'Esho Dhumketur Rajye' (Come to the world of comets) is already in the press. Eminent scientist, Dr. Abdullah Almuti Sharfuddin has written the preface of the book.

Three more manuscripts on scientific interest, are ready for publication. The books are on space and cosmos, on solar system and on atom.
