

SSC exams uncertain

The Secondary School Certificate Examinations (S.S.C.) under the four boards of the country are scheduled to begin on March 6.

But the holding of examinations have become uncertain because of the abstention of the non-government school teachers from duties since February 22.

The teachers of the non-government schools are demanding nationalisation of their services with the benefits given to their government school colleagues.

Meanwhile, Teachers of non-government schools continued their strike for the fifth day on Wednesday in support of their two-point demand.

of the Bangladesh Sikkhak Samannoy Parishad (Coordination Council of the Teachers of Bangladesh) the Education Boards of the country stopped delivering different papers and documents related to SSC examinations following the teachers strike.

Bangladesh Teachers Association on Wednesday vowed to continue the strike till the demands were met.

College teachers to go on strike

Teachers of the non-government colleges of the country will go on strike for an indefinite period from March 6 to press home their 3-point demand. The demands include nationalisation of college education introduction of new modified national pay scale in non-government colleges removal of discrimination between the students of government and non-government colleges.

The decision was taken at an extended meeting of the National Executive Council of the Bangladesh College Teachers Association on Tuesday. The meeting was presided over by Principal Abdul Mannan, President of BCTA.
