



The New Nation 25 NOV 1988 Magistrate, 4 others assaulted by examinees

GAZIPUR, Nov 24: Five persons including a magistrate on duty were injured today in an untoward incident which occurred due to search of the body of a degree examinee at Tongi Government College.

As a student was being searched by the magistrate, some other candidates left the examination hall in protest.

The outsiders moving around the examination centre joined them to launch an attack on the magistrate and invigilators. In the volley of brickbats the magistrate, Nurul Islam, two professors and two students sustained injury.

During the commotion the

question papers were out and a bullet went in the air off the rifle of a constable, who was standing beside the bleeding magistrate.

The situation was, however, brought under control by Gazi pur Zila Parishad Chairman Hasanuddin Sarker.

some examinees were prevented from adopting unfair means in the hall as a result, the examinees became violent and at one stage started damaging the chairs and tables and for the answer scripts. Other reexaminees also left the hall at about 2-30 pm. A total of 450 candidates today appeared at the secretarial science examination in second shift.
