In the present econo. mic situation, they pay more attention to and devote more time in money making ness Of course, there are some teachers who are much devoted to their profession and determined to repel copying practice in the examination halls at any cost. What is needed is security and protection of the invigilators.

Meanwhile, it will not De possible to bring about any improvement in our existing educational arena until and unless we can make our society free of the elements who are quite secretly but very effecti. vely working to jecpardise the very foundation of this co. untry's education.
