from the same centre for copying. At the Lalmatia Girl's College centre the students of Islamia Mahila College, particularly their science students cheated in almost all the subjects. The

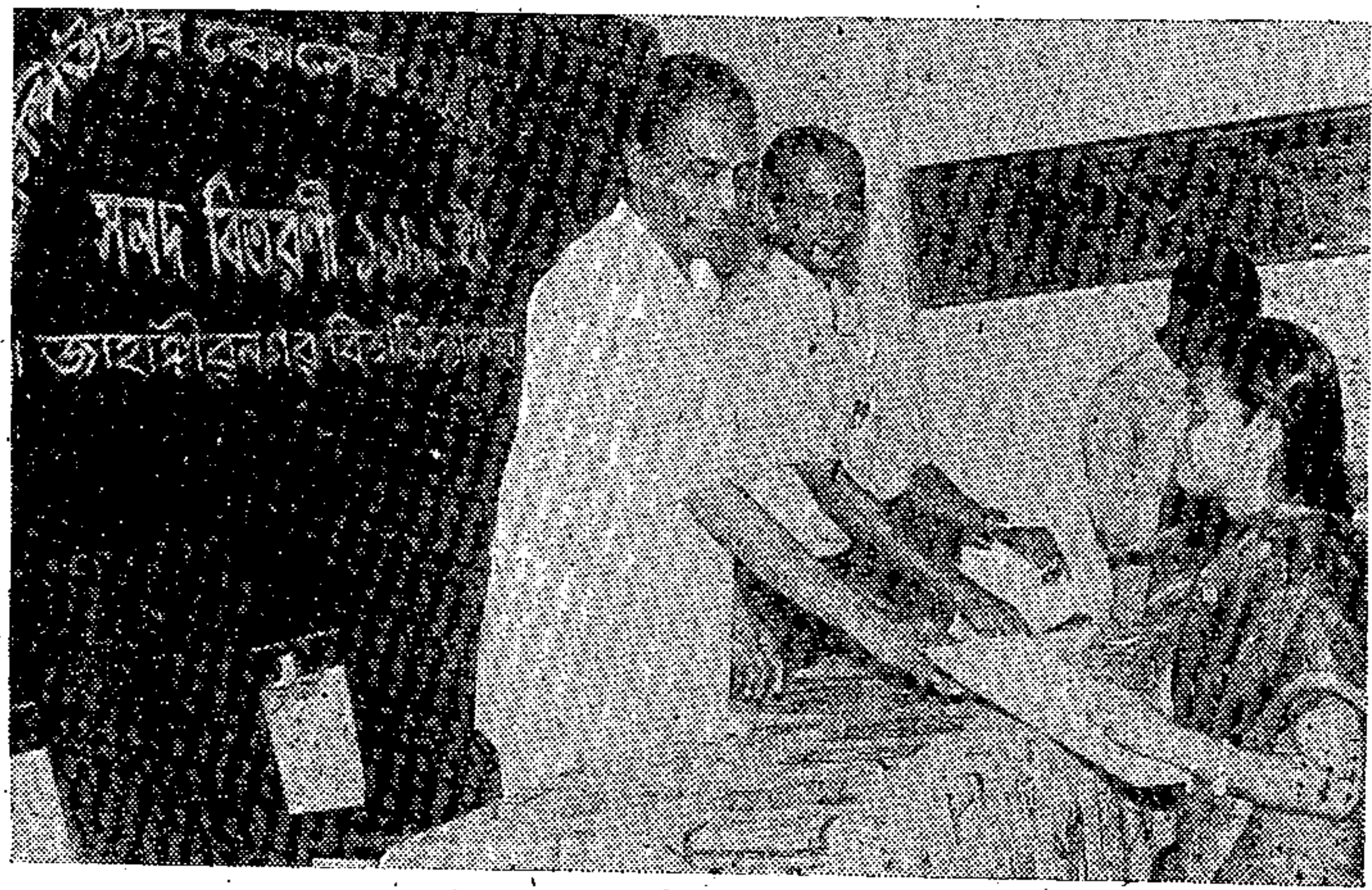
becoming increasingly risky and troublesome for the concerned people to conduct the exams. There are instances where the invigilators are manhandled for no fault of theirs.

It is difficult to root out this malady but even now there are a number of educational institutions in the country who charge a high fee from the students guaranteeing them rights to mass copy in the exams. These institutions try to purchase the local administration too so that they overlook such things.

In one such centre at Trishal, the college principal took Tk 3000/- from each HSC candidate assuring them that the magistrate would not interfere. But unfortunately things were different. The magistrate came and he was a very strict person, the students couldnot cheat and so they were furious at the principal.

The Boards of Intermediate and Secondary Education have a list of institutions who process papers for registration at the eleventh hour—these are mainly the cases of students who migrate from the cities to the rural areas to cheat. registration should be expedited. This may help to bring down mass copying in exams.

Above all, invigilators should be placed on duty in class rooms. They should know their duties and look for cheating. Emphasis should be placed on technical education in class rooms.
