

29.19 pass DU BA exams

Results of BA, BSc, BCom, BSc (Home Economics), and BMus examinations of 1990 under Dhaka University were published in Dhaka yesterday (Wednesday), reports BSS.

According to a notification of the Controller of Examinations, 29.19 per cent passed in BA, 40.87 in BSc, 40.45 in BCom, 97.5 in BSc (Home Economics) and 59.52 per cent passed in BMus.

The statistics of the results showed that a total of 50,320 regular students appeared in BA examinations of which 14,689 passed. Of the successful candidates 21 got first division, 5,445 second division and 9,222 passed in the third division.

Besides, out of 11,954 external candidates a total of 3,348 came out successfully, the percentage of pass being 28. Of the successful candidates, one got first division, 1,064 second division while 2,283 passed in third division.

Out of 193 colleges from
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where the students appeared in the BA examinations, the results of the seven colleges were not published, due to various irregularities. The colleges are: Government Anand Mohan College, Mymensingh, Government Gurudayal College, Kishoreganj, Hossainpur Degree College, Kuliarchar Degree College, Katidahi College, Hatirdia Rajiuddin College and Motilal Degree College.

Siddeshwari Girls College with 89.23 per cent of pass topped the list of the successful candidates followed by Narsingdi Mohila College with 75 per cent, Shibpur Government Shaheed Asad College with 73.07 per cent and Adamjee Cantonment College with 71.58 per cent.

Meanwhile, no students from Hafez Ziaur Rahman College and Bangabanshi College could come out successful.

A total of 8,248 candidates from 65 colleges appeared in the BSc examinations of which 3,371 passed. Of the successful students, 49 received first division, 1,698 second division and 1,622 students third division.

Outstanding results were made by the students of Central Women's College from where all

the 19 candidates came out successful. Besides, none from this college got third division.

In the BCom examinations, 10,678 students from 152 colleges appeared of whom 4,320 candidates came out successfully. Of them two got first division, 1,078 second division and 3,240 third division.

The results of Sher-e-Bangla Degree College, Shikarpur, Barisal, Gurudayal Government Degree College, Hossainpur Degree College, Kuliarchar Degree College, Kathiadi Degree College, Motilal Degree College, Hatirdia Degree College and Kabi Nazrul Government College were not published for various irregularities.

Abul Kalam College of Barisal with 90 per cent of pass, Amtali Degree College with 88.89 per cent of pass and Ispahani College of Keraniganj, Dhaka with 83.33 per cent of pass secured the first, second and third places respectively in the list of the successful candidates.

Meanwhile, the students of Madhabdi Mohabiddalaya, Shingair College, Sushangha Snatak Mohabiddalaya, Nazrul College, Trishal, Anandamohan College, Mymensingh, Hemnagar College, BCRG College, Pakutia, Muksudpur College, Kalkini College, Hamayciuddin College, Jhalakathi, Nalchithi Degree College, Sher-e-Bangla Fazlul Haq College, Binoykathi, Agairjhala College, Barisal, Barguna Government Mohila College, and Barguna Government College could not keep the prestige of their respective institutions as none from these 16 colleges came out successfully in the BCom examinations.

In the BSc (Home Economics), 15 candidates got first division, 24 second division and none third division.

Candidates bearing roll numbers 53261, 53275 and 53260 of Home Economics College, Dhaka, stood first, second and third respectively.

In B Mus, two students got first division, 21 second division and two third division.

The results of the subsidiary examinations of BA, BSc and BCom were also announced yesterday.

According to the results published by the Controller of Examinations, out of 3,703 candidates, 2,554 came out successfully in the BA subsidiary, the percentage of pass being 69.

In the BSc subsidiary, a total of 3,160 students appeared of whom 922 passed, the percentage of pass being 29.2.

In the BCom subsidiary, 2,693 candidates appeared of whom 601 came out successfully. The percentage of pass is 22.3.
