

### Terrorists' still at large, says DUTA

The Dhaka University Teachers Association yesterday (Sunday) urged the government to give them opportunity of teaching in a congenial atmosphere by taking effective steps against the 'terrorists' roaming on the campus, reports UNB.

The DUTA demand came at a special meeting with its President Prof Anwarullah Chowdhury in the chair that reviewed the campus situation.

It observed although violent activities had apparently decreased due to teachers movement, there might be fresh bloodshed if classes begin.

The teachers said arms were still in the halls and hoodlums moving at large in campus areas.

They have been on the indefinite strike from November 2 protesting what they say government's failure to contain campus violence.

"Teachers are willing to attend classes, but the situation is still volatile," the teachers' meeting said, adding they are fully aware about the loss the students are suffering in their academic life.

DUTA will hold another meeting on November 23, says a press release.
