## CU bans rallies

## Shibir calls hartal in Ctg today

CHITTAGONG, Sept 6:—Bangladesh Islami Chhatra Shibir — student wing of Jamaat-e-Islami — called a dawn-to-dusk hartal here in the port city tomorrow.

Islami Chhatra Shibir announced the hartal this afternoon in support of its three point demand immediate and unconditional release of its workers and leaders, rehabilitation of the ousted Shibir activists at the student dormitories of Chittagong University and stoppage of police harassment.

Several Shibir activists brought out a procession in the city to drum up support for tomorrow's dawn-todusk hartal. Earlier, in the pre-dawn hours of Sunday police arrested 11 Shibir activists from a house at Nawab Sirajuddawla Road.

UNB adds: The Chittagong University authorities have imposed ban on processions and rallies by the student organisations on the campus till September 15.

The decision has been taken today (Sunday) at a meeting of the Syndicate in the afternoon, chaired by Vice Chancellor Prof Abdul Mannan.

The meeting requested the rail authorities to resume its shuttle train services which remained suspended following some untoward incidents.

The meeting also expressed its dissatisfaction over the gherao programme, called by Chhatra Shibir, and shock at the tragic death of Sanjay, a second year student of Fine Arts.

The authorities asked the law enforcing agency to a extend their necessary co-operation to run the university smoothly.
