DU authorities to hold separate meetings with student bodies

In a bid to restore peace on the campus, Dhaka University authorities have decided to separately sit with the student organisations, beginning today, reports UNB.

by Vice Chancellor Prof AK Azad Chowdhury, a meeting will be held with the leaders of BNP-backed Jatiyatabadi Chhatra Dal (JCD) this afternoon.

The JCD leaders are now staying outside the campus.

The authorities will hold talks with the leaders of pro-Awami League Chhatra League and Ganotantrik Chhatra Oikya (GCO), a conglomerate of the left leaning student bodies, on Friday and Saturday respectively.

According to officials, letters in this regard have already been issued from the VC's office to the JCD leaders, inviting them to the meeting.

"I want to create a common ground for a broader dialogue with all student organisations.

after holding talks with the leaders of these major organisations first," the Vice Chancellor told UNB.
