3 cases filed

Bangladesh Chhatra League (BCL) and another two by police were lodged with Ramna thana on Friday in connection with the killing of a Dhaka University student and Thurs-

day's campus violence.

Bahadur Bepary, DU unit President of BCL (S-P) filed a case against 18 workers of Jatiyatabadi Chhatra Dal (JCD) including JCD President Shahiduddin Chowdhury Ani and General Secretary Habib-un-Nabi Sohel for the killing of BCL central committee member Partha Pratim Achariya, police sources said.

Earlier, police took 24 JCD activists on two days' remand for interrogation. 24 JCD activists along with another 31 students were picked up from Jasimuddin Hall of the university on Thursday. Police released 31 students on Thursday night after interrogation.

APB adds: An uneasy calm was prevailing on the Dhaka University campus since Thursday's fierce clashes between Bangladesh Chhatra League and Jatiyatabadi Chhatra Dal that left one student killed and several others injured.

Partha Pratim Achariya, a BCL leader and student of Mass Communication and Journalism, was killed in the gunfight that occurred as a sequel to a silly incident.

Campus sources said cadres of BCL were seen guarding the entrances of Jasimuddin, Ziaur Rahman : and Bangabandhu Halls, earlier known to be JCD strongholds.

Most of the resident students left.

Three separate cases—one by those halls apprehending further clashes.

Meanwhile, a huge contingent of police personnel, including armed police, were deployed in and around the campus.

Ramna police sent 24 people including students, who were arrested on Thursday, to the court. Three cases were filed against them on // charges of killing and creating anar-

chy on the campus.

Earlier on Thursday night, police released 44 students, out of 65, arrested from Kabi Jasimuddin Hall.

BCL workers, wearing black badges, brought out a procession on the campus Friday to mourn the death of Partha.

Jewel, one of the bullet-injured, was shifted to CMH after his condition had deteriorated, DMCH sources said.
