

46.8 pc pass HSC exams

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The results of the Higher Secondary Certificate (HSC) examinations held in May-June this year under the country's five education boards were published simultaneously on Thursday.

A total of 4,79,028 students appeared at the examinations under Dhaka, Comilla, Rajshahi, Jessore and Chittagong boards. Of them 2,20,748 came out successful.

The average percentage of pass of the five boards is 46.8.

S.M. Niaz Arifin, Roll No. 122442 of Mirzapur Cadet College, got the highest marks 953 among the successful candidates of the five boards. He got distinction in four subjects.

A total of 154,662 candidates sat for the examinations under Dhaka Board, of them 69,008 came out successful. The percentage of pass is 44.62.

Of the successful students, 17,556 got first divisions, 42,267 second divisions and 9,185 third divisions.

In Comilla Board 37190 students came out successful out of a total 72333 appeared at the examinations. The percentage of pass is 51.41.

Of the successful candidates, 5312 examinees secured first division, 26031 second division and 5847 third division.

A total of 1,24,699 students appeared at the examinations in Rajshahi Board, of them 64,558 passed. The percentage of pass is 51.77.

Out of the successful students,

11,671 got first division, 44,898 second division and 7,989 third division.

In Jessore, Board, a total of 90,884 students sat for the examinations and 35,729 passed. The percentage of pass is 39.31. Of the successful examinees, 10,175 secured first division, 22,906 second division and 2,648 third division.

In Chittagong Board, 14,263 examinees passed out of 36,450 appeared in the examinations. The

percentage of pass is 39.13. Of them, 2,285 got first division, 9,858 second division and 2,120 third division.

In Dhaka Board, Mohammad Merajul Islam Molla (Roll No. 105138) of Notre Dame College secured the second position in the combined merit list of science group, obtaining 949 marks with letters in four subjects, followed by Mehedi Bakth (Roll No. 122462) of Mirzapur Cadet College with 940 marks.

Tahmina Zaman of Ideal School and College (Roll No. 316153) secured first in the merit list of the humanities group with 893 marks.

Ishtiaq Ahmed (Roll No. 507117) of Dhaka City College captured the first position in the merit list of Commerce group with 836 marks.

In Rajshahi Board, Mohammad Anupam Shaikat (Roll No. 110412) of Government A.H. College, Bogra, secured the top position in the combined merit list of the Science group, bagging 936 marks with distinctions in four subjects. Lenin Mehedy (Roll No. 114986) of Rangpur Cadet College secured the second position in the Science group with 932 marks.

Md. Ruhul Amin (Roll No. 344391) of Bogra Cantonment Public School and College topped the merit list in the Humanities group obtaining 854 marks.

Tanzina Hossain (Roll No. 502883) of Government Edward College, Pabna, and M.S.F. Afroza (Roll No. 503435) of Nizamuddin

Azgar College, Sujangar, jointly secured the first position in the Commerce Group obtaining 966 marks both.

In Jessore Board, Md. Hafiz-al-Asad (Roll No. 502663) of Barisal Cadet College topped the combined merit list in the Science Group, securing 944 marks with letters in four subjects.

Ishtia Rony (Roll No. 612525) of Amritalal Dey College, Barisal, secured the first position in the merit list of the Humanities Group with 929 marks.

Khalifah Abdulla Mamun (Roll No. 702971) of Alhaz B.N. Khan Degree College Barisal, topped the merit list in the Commerce Group with 838 marks.

In Comilla Board, Amrita Bikram Deb (Roll No. 100913) of Sylhet M.C. College topped the combined merit list of the Science Group securing 935 marks with letters in four subjects.

Md. Khorshed Alam (Roll No. 331804) of Haziganj Model College secured the top position in the Humanities Group with 840 marks.

Mir Md. Mukhlesur Rahman (Roll No. 512134) of Adhyapak Abdul Mazid College, Comilla secured the first position in the merit list of the Commerce Group with 784 marks.

In Chittagong Board, Md. Giasuddin (Roll No. 100653) of Chaittagong College topped the combined merit list of the Science Group securing 900 marks with four letters.

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Ashna Yasmin Rahman (Roll No. 301488) of Chittagong College secured the first position in the Humanities group with 852 marks.

Syed Ashékul Kabir Mahmood (Roll No. 504380) of Chittagong Public School and College obtained the top position in the merit list of the Commerce Group with 751 marks.
