47.96 pc pass SSC exams

The results of the Secondary School Certificate (SSC) examinations held under the country's five education boards this year were announced on Sunday.

The examinations were held in March-April this year with the similar set of question papers and the results were announced simultaneously from the respective boards.

A total of 7,22,300 students appeared in the examinations under the five boards — Dhaka, Comilla, Jessore, Rajshahi and Chittagong — this year, of them 3,46,435 came out successful. Out of the total successful examinees, 1,51,579 got first

division, 1,90,172 second division while 2,693 third division.

The average percentage of pass this year is 47.96.

The boardwise pass percentage is: Dhaka 51.17, Comilla 52.87, Jessore 44.63, Rajshahi 48.32 and Chittagong 33.23.

In Dhaka Board a total of 2,10,270 students appeared in the examinations (new and old syllabus), of them 1,07,598 passed. Of the successful examinees, 48,883 secured first division, 57,958 second division and 757 third division.

Under Comilla Board 1,19,691 students took part in the examinations, of them 63,276 came out

successful. 31,224 got first division, 31,689 second division while 363 third division.

A total of 1,36,311 students appeared in the examinations under Jessore Board and 60,829 came out successful. Of them, 23,163 obtained first division, 35,235 second division and 431 third division.

In Rajshahi Board, 1,96,487 students sat for the examinations, of them 94,945 passed. 38,537 examinees secured first division, 55,443 second division and 963 third division.

Under Chittagong Board, a total of 59,541 students appeared in the

examinations and out of them 19,787 came out successful. Of the successful students 9,772 got first division, 9,837 second division and 178 third division.

Chowdhury Sharif Hasan of Gov-

ernment Laboratory High School, Rajshahi (bearing Roll No. 100040) got the highest 959 marks among the students secured top position in the combined merit lists of the five education boards. Hasan got letters in nine subjects — Bengali, English, Mathematics, Social Science, Isla-

mic Studies, Physics, Chemistry, Elective Mathematics and Biology.

UNB adds: Dhaka Board: A total of 1,26,813 students, including 55,048 female, appeared in the exam under the new syllabus. Of them, 57,662 came out successful with pass percentage of 45.47. The pass percentage of male and female was 47.95 and 42.24 per cent respectively.

The number of examinees from Science, Humanities and Business Studies groups were 52,836, 55,482 and 18,495 respectively. From these groups 33,438 (63.29 per cent), 15,469 (27.88 per cent) and 8,755 (47.34 per cent) students respective-

ly passed the exam.

In Science group, 27,617 got first division, 5,818 second division and only three (all girls) third division. A total of 3,972 secured first division in Humanities while 11,203 second division and 294 third division. In Business Studies group, the first, second and third division holders were 5,043, 3,699 and 13.

The number of appeared students under the old syllabus from this board was 83,457, including 37,774 female. Of them, 49,936 passed the exam (59.83 per cent). The pass percentage of male and female was 60.93 and 58.51 respectively.

A total of 27,807 took part in the exam under Science while 55,650 under Social Science groups, of them 18,759 and 31,177 came out successful respectively.

Comilla Board: A total of 84,698 students, including 38,027 female, appeared in the exam under the new syllabus. Of them, 40,469 came out successful with pass percentage of 47.78.

The number of examinees from Science, Humanities and Business Study groups were 34,125, 36,739 and 13,834 respectively. From these groups 21,680 (63.53 per cent), 11,831 (32.20 per cent) and 6,958 (50.30 per cent) students respectively passed the exam.

In Science group, 16,928 got first division, 4,749 second division and only three (all boys) third division. A total of 2,557 secured first division in Humanities while 9,097 second division and 177 third division. In Business Study group, the first, second and third division holders were 3,654, 3,286 and 16.

The number of appeared students under the old syllabus from this board was 34,993, including 15,948 female. Of them, 22,807 passed the exam (65.18 per cent).

A total of 10,682 candidates took part in the exam under General Science while 24,311 under Social Science groups, of them 8,357 and 14,450 came out successful respectively.

Rajshahi Board: A total of 1,18,451 male and 78,036 female candidates appeared in the examinations from the board. The pass percentage is 50.09 and 45.64.

In Science and General Science groups, 62,304 students took part under new and old syllabuses. Of them, 40,345 became successful with a pass rate of 64.76 per cent. Among them, 27,431 got first division, 12,890 second division and only 24 third division.

A total of 1,31,082 students sat for the exam from Humanities and So-

cial Science groups. Of them, 53,111 (40.52 per cent) passed the exam. The first second and third divisions holders from the groups are 10,299, 41,879 and 938 respectively.

In Business Studies group, 1,484 candidates came out successful out of 3,101 appeared examinees. The pass rate is 47.86 per cent. Of them 807 secured first division, 674 second division and only 3 (all boys) third division.

Jessore Board: A total of 80,814 male and 55,497 female examinees appeared in the exam from the board under both new and old syllabuses. The pass percentage is 46.30 and 42.90.

Out of 30,694 appeared students from Science and General Science groups, 19,625 came out successful. The pass percentage is 63.94. Among them, 14,429 secured first division, 5,189 second division and only 7 third division.

In Humanities and Social Science, a total of 96,886 students appeared in the exam and of them 37,534 (34.74 per cent) became successful. The first, second and third divisions holders are 8,543, 28,573 and 418 respectively.

The number of appeared students in Business Studies group was 8,731. Of them, 3,670 students passed the exam with a pass rate of 42.03 per cent. Among them 2,191 got first division, 1,473 second division and only 6 third division.

Chittagong Board: A total of 42,454 students appeared in the exam under the new syllabus. Of them, 11,994 came out successful with pass percentage of 28.25.

The number of examinees from Science, Humanities and Business Study groups were 15,273, 18,598, and 8,583 respectively. From the groups 7,411 (48.52 per cent), 2,433 (13.08 per cent) and 2,150 (25.05 per cent) students respectively passed the exam.

In Science group, 5,910 got first division, 1,499 second division and only two (both girls) third division. A total of 514 secured first division in Humanities while 1,854 second division and 65 third division. In Business Study group, the first, second and third divisions holders were 1,177, 967 and six.

The number of appeared students under the old syllabus from this board was 17,087. Of them 7,793 (45.60 per cent) passed the exam.

A total of 4,773 students took part in the exam under General Science and 12,314 under Social Science groups, of them 2,749 and 5,044 came out successful respectively.
