# SSC exams result under five boards announced

The results of the Secondary School Certificate (SSC) examinations, held under the country's five education board in March this year, were published simultaneously on Thursday.

A total of 8,37,220 examinees appeared in the examinations from Dhaka, Rajshahi, Jessore, Comilla and Chittagong boards, of them 4,57,252 came out successful.

The average percentage of pass of these five boards is 54.62.

A.F.M. Noor-Uz-Zaman of Mirzapur Cadet College topped the merit list securing the highest 958 marks among the examinees of the five boards. He got letter marks in nine subjects.

Of the total successful examinees 1,96,263 secured First Division, 2,24,814 Second Division, 5,913 Third Division while 30,262 examinees were given Pass Division on special consideration.

The percentage of pass is—53 in Dhaka Board, 49.43 in Rajshahi Board, 58.75 in Jessore Board, 56.38 in Comilla Board and 59.86 in Chittagong Board.

A total of 2,34,565 students sat for the examinations under Dhaka Board this year. Of the total 1,24,885 students came out successful. Among the successful

students 59,005 got First Division, 56,655 Second Division, 1067 Third Division and 8158 Special Pass mark.

A.F.M. Noor-Uz-Zaman of Mirzapur Cadet College bearing

Roll No. 140291 topped the Combined Merit List in Science Group of Dhaka Board. He secured 958 marks with distinction in nine subjects. Ahsanul Karim of the same college bearing Roll No. 140284 secured second position by obtaining 953 marks while Md. Wasi-Ur-Rahman of Udayan Biddyalaya (Roll No. 106591) bagged third place of

obtaining 951 marks. Both of them got letter marks in nine subjects.

The number of students appeared in the examinations from Rajshahi Board was 2,43,307. Of them 1,20,983 came out successful. Out of the successful examinees 48,581 were placed in First Division, 64,488 in Second Division, 1734 Third Division while 6180 students were given Special Pass Division. 1,44,294 male and 99013 female students appeared in the examinations from the Board.

Mohammad Golam Mostafa Bhuiyan of Pabna Cadet College and Imtiaz Ahmed of Rangpur Zilla School topped the combined Merit List in Science Group securing 945 marks each. They got letter marks in nine subjects.

In Jessore Board, a total of 1,52,364 students sat for the examinations. Of them 89,516 examinees succeeded. Of the successful examinees 35,524 obtained First Division, 46,026 Second Division, 1402 Third Division and 6564 were given Special Pass Division. A total of 88,768 male and 63,596 female students appeared in the examinations from Jessore Board.

Shuvendu Biswas of Daud Public School, Jessore stood first in the Combined Merit List of Science Group securing 928 marks. He got letter marks in eight subjects.

A total of 1,38,491 students appeared in the examination from Comilla Board. Of them 80,622 came out successful. Among the successful students 38,081 students got First Division, 33,974 Second Division, 695 Third Division and 7872 students were given Pass Division on special consideration.

Mohammad Tanvir Rahman of Sylhet Cadet College (Roll No. 100018) topped the Combined

Merit List in Science Group obtaining 931 marks. He got letter marks in seven subjects.

Sharmin Kamrun Abu Ahmed of Dr. Khastagir Govt. Girls' High School, Chittagong bearing Roll No. 113674 secured the first position in Chittagong Board in the Combined Merit List of Science Group. She obtained 926 marks with distinction in eight subjects.

The number of students sat for the examinations from Chittagong Board was 64,493. Of them 41,246 became successful.

Of the successful examinees 15,072 got First Division, 23,671 Second Division, 1015 Third Division and 1488 were given Special Pass Division. The number of male and female examinees appeared in the examinations was 37188 and 31305 respectively.
