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Gap between schools

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According to the plan, higher secondary classes will be introduced in selected secondary schools on the basis of needs and resources. The intermediate college will also be encouraged to open classes from grade VI to X of secondary educa. tion.

The existing marking system of secondary and higher secon dary boards will also be computerized.

In case of administrative measures, the Ministry plans to bifurcate the Directorate of Secondary and Higher Second dary Education into two separate directorates, one for second dary education and other for higher education

The Ministry also adopted policy to privatise the product tion, printing and distribution of text books at secondary and higher secondary levels by keeping the responsibility of quality control with Textbook Board.

The management of education system will be strengthen. ed through restructuring and appointing qualified personnel in senior I management tions.
