
Abul Mansur Ahmed dead

Eminent politician, littera teur and journalist late Mr. Abut Mansur Ahmed was born on September 3, 1898, at Dhanikhola village under Trishal Thana of Mymensingh District.

Son of late Mr. Abdur Rahim Farazi, he had three brothers and one eister. He started his education from his village school and had his matriculation in 1917. Mr. Anmed graduated in 1921 from Dacca College.

He obtained his degree in law in 1929 but took up journalism instead of joining the Dar:
