Prof. Malik Khusro dead

Professor Malik Khusro Chowdhury, professor of economics, University of Dacca, died of heart failure on Sunday in Bangkok, he was 48 according to a University Press release, says BSS.

He is survived by his widow one son and two daughters. His body will be brought in Dacca today (Tuesday) on October 3 by Thai Airlines. His Namaz-e-Janaza will be held at the University mosque after Zohr prayers the same day.

Dr. Chowdhury went to Indonesia as a short term consultant for a field mission in Indonesia, on a ESCAP project.

Dr. Khusro was born at Tangail in 1930. He passed his B.A Honours examination in economics from Dacca University in 1950 and B. Sc. economics examination from London University in 1953. He obtained his Ph. D. from Manchester University in 1967.

He was appointed Reader in

economics and Director, Bureau of Economic Research, University of Dacca in 1969. He became professor and chairman of the department of economics Jahangir Nagar University in 1971 and later Dean of the Faculty of Social Science of the same University. He was a visiting fellow at Yale University in December 1975. He joined as professor of economics in the University of Dacca in November 1976, the post he held till his death.
