# 39360 apply for 3542 Hons seats

A total of 39,360 applications have been submitted against 3542 seats in first year honours classes of 40 departments under six faculties of Dhaka University for the session 1989-90.

The last date for submission of applications expired yesterday.

The applications were received through four units—'ka',

'kha' 'ga' and 'gha'.

The students of Science group, Arts group and Commerce group applied through the 'ka' unit, 'kha' unit, and 'ga' unit respectively. While those who intend to change their group applied through the 'gha' unit.
