In many Asian countries at present only a small number of blind children receive any kind of assistance. In Indone. sia, there are about **300,000** 🚕 blind children, but only 18,000 get special care. In India according to an estimate of the World Council for the Welfare of the Blind out of one million blind children only 15,000 are being assisted. In Bangladesh of the 200,000 only less than. are being helped by either a Government or nongovernment agency to become self-reliant. This is a serious situation because the blind child is often the most vulner. able, the most neglected, and the most deprived of all child. ren.

as "Assistance for Blind Children (ABC) was established last April in Dacca to provide services for blind children in Bangladesh. The organisation was later registered with the Deptt of Social Welfare and became an Associate Member of the World Council for the Welfare of the Blind.

It has also established a de. monstration project for rural blind children who can be taught to participate in the daily activities of village life.
